# Quarterly Ringing Practice and Meeting – Saturday, 11th October

The practice and meeting at **High Ercall** on the **11**<sup>th</sup> **October**, attracted about thirty members. Tony Freemont led the ringing, which included lots of rounds and call changes, Plain Hunt on 7, Grandsire Triples, Plain Bob Major and Cambridge Surprise Major. It was good to ring such a variety, and to be joined by several newish ringers, including one of our juniors.

Our practice was in competition with generous refreshments provided by Chris and Judy Yates, and the High Ercall band.

Our Master, Tony, also chaired a short business meeting. We welcomed five new members: Coralie Thornton from Oswestry, and from Whitchurch Tony Kowalewski, Helene Loam, Anne-Maria Taylor and Paul Welburn.

The Committee are proposing a small but significant change to the Bell Restoration Fund Rules. At present any request for grant aid for a project of over £2,000 requires specifications and estimates from two companies. Andrew Gordon has pointed out that it is now very difficult to get inspections

from bell engineers for small projects, and they generally charge for visits. In view of this, and inflation, it is now proposed that projects costed at over £4,000 should require a second specification and estimate. A clarification to the status of ring-fenced funds within the account has been submitted by David Beckwith. These changes will be circulated to the membership and voted on at the January AGM.

Nik Galton ran the raffle, which raised £52 for the bell fund. Winners were: Phil Murphy, Josephine Wrin, Madeline Harris, Chris Yates, Nik Galton and Vicki Sivess.

# Tower Leaders' Get Together Saturday, 18<sup>th</sup> October at Hodnet

John and Karen Powell very kindly hosted our tower leaders get together at Hodnet, when we had to move from Edgmond church because of a failure of the heating there. Representatives from Oswestry, St Martins, Baschurch, Meole Brace, Shrewsbury, High Ercall, Market Drayton, Hodnet, Newport, Edgmond, Lilleshall and Dawley met to discuss a variety of issues that affect us all.

Matt Lawrence opened the first session with some ideas about recruitment. It's important to have a clear focus: a campaign to recruit a whole new band will be different from building on an existing band. If you already have some ringers you need to have their support and involvement. Teaching and integrating new ringers into the band will take a long time and will impact on any existing practice. He discussed various forms of communication and advertisement.

Simon Rice then described building a new band at Dawley, over several years and, initially, with help from Darren Swancott. They taught beginners in separate sessions, which we all agreed was more effective than a couple of short goes during normal practice.

On the subject of retaining ringers Michael Carding observed that it is important to develop a friendly culture among tower members. Outings, parties, swap shops and above all time to chat and get to know one another are all valuable.

Several tower representatives observed that they didn't feel experienced enough to teach bell handling. We agreed that it was unreasonable to expect all tower captains to teach - they are doing a good job in keeping practices and service ringing going. There is a shortage of teachers, both locally and nationally. The ART offers a course, together with ongoing mentoring, to develop new teachers and give them confidence. Some who had done the course observed that it also makes you focus on your own ringing, particularly any weaknesses.

We moved on to ideas for running a practice, covering planning, content and record keeping. Then we broke for refreshments and more chat in small groups, before moving upstairs to try out some exercises that add variety to call change ringing, followed by some simple aids to improve bell control and move towards method ringing. Paul Lewis produced a hilarious game which had us pacing out our 'places' on the floor.

Our last talk session began with Michael Carding, running through the celebratory programme for the first half of the Centenary year, especially some of the planned activities that rely on towers taking the initiative. There will be plenty going on to help develop both culture and ringing among bands in the Association.

Finally, Tony Freemont explained the current Church of England safeguarding strategy, and its requirements for church volunteers, including bell ringers. He had organised a meeting with Sarah Fullard, who is responsible for delivering safeguarding training in the Lichfield diocese. He asked for

questions and concerns that he would raise with her. It was clear that a wide range of views, and understanding, pertains across our Association towers.

We ran over time, and broke up, still exchanging ideas and opinions. Although there are no easy solutions, we hope that getting together at least helps tower leaders to feel less isolated. Very many thanks to John and Karen for making the bells and church available, and for their generous refreshments.
