## Calling All Young Ringers National Youth Ringing, Birmingham, Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> July

Last July a record 37 teams of young ringers (under 19) went to London for the National Youth Ringing contests. They travelled from as far afield as Cornwall and Durham, some to take part in six and eight bell competitions for call change and method ringing, some to take on the challenge of ringing with other young ringers from all over the country, on a variety of bells.

This year the competition is to be held in Birmingham, on 5<sup>th</sup> July. We feel it is high time Shropshire was involved, and a day out in Birmingham beckons. We would like to take any young ringers who want to go, whether it's two of you or twenty. If you would like to get a team together to compete, we will organise practices for you to get to know one another, perhaps in the Easter Holiday.

Our young ringers are scattered about, usually one or two in a tower. We know it can be hard to meet up, but if you're interested do get in touch and we will see what we can do.

Parents are, of course, very welcome to come and help (though they might not get a ring!).
