
## St Bartholomew's Moreton Corbet

After 100 years Moreton Corbet's 7 cwt six has just received a makeover. The cast iron bell frame has been cleaned and repainted in red. The bells have been lifted from their pits and their bearings cleaned/replaced as necessary, and the clappers, crown staples and rope roller boxes have been returned to Taylors of Loughborough for complete refurbishment.

#### Returning by popular demand


Enjoy an evening with good food, good company, a drink from the bar, music and dancing!
